THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JERSEY CITY DOES ORDAIN:

WHEREAS, the City of Jersey City (the City) does possess rights-of-way through all public streets, thoroughfares and sidewalks located within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:67-1 et seq. and N.J.S.A. 40-A:12-5 to establish, change the grade of or vacate any public street, highway, lane or alley, or any part thereof at the discretion of the City; and

WHEREAS, Public Service Enterprise Group, a New Jersey gas and electric company (Petitioner) has filed a petition with the Municipal Council of the City of Jersey City requesting the vacation of a portion of Factory Street as is more particularly described in the attached Exhibit A dated June 27, 2017 entitled Description of Proposed Vacation of Factory Street to be Vacated, as prepared by Greg S. Gloor, Professional Land Surveyor, New Jersey License Number 37189 of Dresdner Robin and set forth on the attached Street Vacation Map on Exhibit B dated as prepared by Greg S. Gloor, Professional Land Surveyor, New Jersey License Number 37189 of Dresdner Robin entitled Factory Street Road Vacation; and

WHEREAS, Factory Street is located within the City of Jersey City, County of Hudson, State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the area being vacated is no longer necessary for the general public use, and the rights of the public will not be injuriously or adversely affected by the requested vacation, and such vacation advances the public safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized to vacate that portion of Factory Street as set forth in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, Petitioner owns and/or controls Block 12404, Lot 2, the parcel(s) directly adjacent to the portion of Factory Street to be vacated; and

WHEREAS, the vacated parcel will be improved as part of an expansion of public utilities for gas and electric and maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the desired portion of Factory Street to be vacated is a "paper dedicated street" and not an active public right of way; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Engineer and Municipal Traffic Engineer have reviewed and approved the proposed vacation of this portion of Factory Street; and

WHEREAS, said Petition has been duly advertised and proof of the giving of due notice of the Petition requesting enactment of this ordinance as required by law has been filed with the City Clerk, and the Municipal Council having held a public hearing thereon, and no objections having been made thereto; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Jersey City that:

Section I: All parts or portions of Factory Street adjacent to Block 12404, Lot 2, and as hereinafter more particularly described and as are shown and delineated on Exhibit A which is annexed to this Ordinance, be and the same are hereby vacated and included into Block 12404, Lot 2, and the public easement and rights therein be and the same are hereby extinguished, which parts of the aforesaid street are more particularly described in the metes and bounds descriptions contained in Exhibit A to this Ordinance, which is incorporated herein by reference.

Section II: All costs and expenses related to the introduction, passage and publication of this Ordinance, including the preparation and mailing of any and all notices related to this ordinance upon property owners within 200 feet of the area to be vacated, shall be borne and paid by the Petitioner

Section III: The Petitioner shall file this Ordinance and the Maps with the Register of the County of Hudson within sixty (60) days after the Ordinance becomes effective.

Section IV: This Ordinance shall be subject to the following:

- 1) In the event the utilities, if any, presently located under the roadways being vacated hereunder, are not moved to another location or abandoned in place, an easement in perpetuity is reserved for the benefit of the City of Jersey City, Jersey City Municipal Utilities Authority and all public utility companies, including any cable television company as defined in the Cable Television Act, P.L. 1972, c. 186 (c. 48:5A-1 et seq.) for the purpose of ingress and egress over and upon the area subject to this vacation ordinance in order to maintain, repair or replace existing utility facilities including water lines, sewer lines, gas line and telephone, electrical and cable television wires and poles which may be located either beneath or above the surface of the area subject to this vacation ordinance.
- 2) No buildings or structures of any kind may be constructed over the water or sewer utilities within this area subject to the easement without the consent of the Chief Engineer of the City of Jersey City and/or the Jersey City Municipal Utilities Authority unless and until those utilities are relocated and/or abandoned.
- 3) In the event that utilities, if any, presently lying in the portion of Factory Street being vacated hereby are relocated, then the easement otherwise created under Section IV(1), shall immediately terminate and the same shall be considered as abandoned by the respective utility company.



TITLE: ORDINANCE APPROVING A FIVE (5) YEAR TAX EXEMPTION PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF N.J.S.A. 40A:21-1, ET SEQ., AND SECTION 304-12 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE FOR PROPERTY DESIGNATED AS BLOCK 22042, LOT 19, ON THE CITY'S TAX MAP AND MORE COMMONLY KNOWN BY THE STREET ADDRESS OF 2124 JOHN F. KENNEDY BOULEVARD (F/K/A 170 GRANT AVENUE)

THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JERSEY CITY DOES ORDAIN:

WHEREAS, the City of Jersey City as an area in need of rehabilitation, is authorized to adopt an ordinance to utilize tax exemptions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:21-1, et seq., the Five (5) Year Exemption and Abatement Law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:21-1 et seq., the City of Jersey City adopted Ordinance 05-060, Section 304-6 et seq. of the Municipal Code, to allow Five (5) Year Tax Exemptions which allows the Tax Assessor to regard the full and true value or a portion thereof of certain improvements as not increasing the full and true value of certain property for a period of five (5) years, provided the owner's application is approved by the Tax Assessor and by Ordinance of the Municipal Council; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:21-9 and Section 304-12 of the Municipal Code, a tax exemption for the construction of a five (5) story building to contain approximately twenty (20) market rate residential units and a garage space with nineteen (19) parking spaces containing approximately 5,545 square feet, is permitted for a period of five (5) years; and

WHEREAS, Grant 170, LLC [Entity], is the owner of Property designated as Block 22402, Lot 19, on the City's Tax Map and more commonly known by the street address of 2124 John F. Kennedy Boulevard (f/k/a 170 Grant Avenue), Jersey City, NJ; and

WHEREAS, the Entity now plans to construct a five (5) story building to contain approximately twenty (20) market rate residential units and a garage space with nineteen (19) parking spaces containing approximately 5,545 square feet; and

WHEREAS, demolition will be completed in six (6) months and construction will be completed in twenty-four (24) months; and

WHEREAS, the tax exemption will be terminated if the applicant fails to demolish and complete construction in accordance with his proposed timeline set forth in the letter dated September 5, 2017 attached to his application; and

WHEREAS, on April 26, 2017, the Entity filed an application for a five (5) year tax exemption to construct a new commercial use Project, a copy of which application is attached hereto; and

ORDINANCE APPROVING A FIVE (5) YEAR TAX EXEMPTION PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF N.J.S.A. 40A:21-1, ET SEQ., AND SECTION 304-12 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE FOR PROPERTY DESIGNATED AS BLOCK 22042, LOT 19, ON THE CITY'S TAX MAP AND MORE COMMONLY KNOWN BY THE STREET ADDRESS OF 2124 JOHN F. KENNEDY BOULEVARD (F/K/A 170 GRANT AVENUE)

WHEREAS, Grant 170, LLC, proposes to pay the City (in addition to the full taxes on the land, which shall continue to be conventionally assessed and are currently taxed at the sum of \$10,935 a tax payment for the new improvements on the property, as follows:

- (a) 2019: the tax year in which the structure will be completed. \$0 taxes due on improvements;
- (b) 2020: the second tax year, 20% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$10,973;
- (c) 2021: the third tax year, 40% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$22,386;
- (d) 2022: the fourth tax year, 60% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$34,250; and
- (e) 2023: the fifth tax year, 80% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$46,581;

WHEREAS, the Tax Assessor has determined that the new construction will generate an additional tax payment of \$10,935 for land and \$58,226 for improvements, for a total of \$69,161 a year; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has agreed that in the event the Citywide revaluation results in a decrease in the estimated amount of actual taxes otherwise due, then for purposes of calculating a tax payment hereunder and for the five (5) year period, the amount shall be calculated on the higher of the amount estimated hereunder or the actual taxes otherwise due; and

WHEREAS, the application for tax exemption was complete and timely filed; the application was approved by the Tax Assessor and the commercial Project is eligible for tax exemption pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:21-9 and Section 304-12 of the Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, upon the expiration of the tax exemption, the total assessment, including both land and improvements, will generate a total tax payment of \$69,161; and

WHEREAS, Grant 170, LLC, has agreed to pay the sum of \$38,468 to the City's Affordable Housing Trust Fund, which shall be paid in intervals set forth in Section 304-28 of the Municipal Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Municipal Council of the City of Jersey City that:

1. The application, attached hereto, for a five (5) year tax exemption for the full and true value of a five (5) story building to contain approximately twenty (20) market rate residential units and a garage space with approximately 5,545 square feet for nineteen (19) parking spaces, located in Block 22402, Lot 19, and more commonly known by the street address of 2124 John F. Kennedy Boulevard (f/k/a 170 Grant Avenue), Jersey City, N.J., is hereby approved; and

ORDINANCE APPROVING A FIVE (5) YEAR TAX EXEMPTION PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF N.J.S.A. 40A:21-1, ET SEQ., AND SECTION 304-12 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE FOR PROPERTY DESIGNATED AS BLOCK 22042, LOT 19, ON THE CITY'S TAX MAP AND MORE COMMONLY KNOWN BY THE STREET ADDRESS OF 2124 JOHN F. KENNEDY BOULEVARD (F/K/A 170 GRANT AVENUE)

2. The Mayor or Business Administrator is hereby authorized to execute a tax exemption agreement which shall contain at a minimum, the following terms and conditions:

- (a) tax payment on the new improvements shall be:
 - (i) Year 1: the tax year in which the structure will be completed. \$0 taxes;
 - (ii) Year 2: the second tax year, 20% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$10,973;
 - (iii) Year 3: the third tax year, 40% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$22,386;
 - (iv) Year 4: the fourth tax year, 60% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$34,250; and
 - (v) Year 5: the fifth tax year, 80% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$46,581.

The applicant has agreed that in the event the Citywide revaluation results in a decrease in the amount of actual taxes otherwise due for purposes of calculating a tax payment hereunder; during this five (5) year period, the amount due hereunder shall be calculated on the higher of the amount estimated above or the actual taxes due after the revaluation; and

(b) The project shall be subject to all federal, state and local laws, and regulations on pollution control, worker safety, discrimination in employment, zoning, planning, and building code requirements pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:21-11(b).

(c) If, during any tax year prior to the termination of the tax agreement, the property owner ceases to operate or disposes of the property, or fails to meet the conditions for qualifying, then the tax which would have otherwise been payable for each tax year shall become due and payable from the property owner as if no exemption and abatement had been granted. The collector forthwith ad the tax collector shall, within 15 days thereof, notify the owner of the property of the amount of taxes due.

(d) With respect to the disposal of the property, where it is determined that the new owner of the property will continue to use the property pursuant to the conditions which qualified the property, no tax shall be due, the exemption shall continue, and the agreement shall remain in effect.

(e) At the termination of a tax exemption agreement, the new improvements shall be subject to all applicable real property taxes as provided by State law and regulation and local ordinance; but nothing herein shall prohibit a project, at the termination of an agreement, from qualifying for, an receiving the full benefits of, any other tax preferences provided by law.

(f) Affordable Housing Trust Fund: \$1,500 x 20 units or \$30,000; and \$1.50 x 5,645 square feet of parking space or \$8,468, for a total of \$38,468.

- 4. This Ordinance will sunset and the Tax Exemption will terminate unless:
 - (a) Demolition of the property is completed and construction commences within six (6) months of the adoption of the within Ordinance; and
 - (b) Construction of the Project is completed within twenty-four (24) months of the date of adoption of the within Ordinance.
- 5. The form of tax exemption agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit B, subject to such modification as the Corporation counsel or Business Administrator deems necessary.
- 6. The Tax Assessor shall send a copy of the fully executed Financial Agreement will be sent to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs within thirty (30) days of execution pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40a:21-11(d).
- A. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- B. This ordinance shall be part of the Jersey City Code as though codified and fully set forth therein. The City Clerk shall have this ordinance codified and incorporated in the official copies of the Jersey City Code.
- C. This ordinance shall take effect at the time and in the manner provided by law.
- D. The City Clerk and Corporation Counsel be and they are hereby authorized and directed to change any chapter numbers, article numbers and section numbers in the event that the codification of this ordinance reveals that there is a conflict between those numbers and the existing code, in order to avoid confusion and possible accidental repealers of existing provisions.

COUNCIL AS A WHOLE
offered and moved adoption of the following ordinance:

CITY ORDINANCE 17-133

TITLE:

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A FIVE (5) YEAR TAX EXEMPTION PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF N.J.S.A. 40A:21-1, ET SEQ., AND SECTION 304-12 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE FOR PROPERTY DESIGNATED AS BLOCK 6001, LOT 35, ON THE CITY'S TAX MAP AND MORE COMMONLY KNOWN BY THE STREET ADDRESS OF 39 NEW YORK AVENUE

THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JERSEY CITY DOES ORDAIN:

WHEREAS, the City of Jersey City as an area in need of rehabilitation, is authorized to adopt an ordinance to utilize tax exemptions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:21-1, et seq., the Five (5) Year Exemption and Abatement Law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:21-1 et seq., the City of Jersey City adopted Ordinance 05-060, Section 304-6 et seq. of the Municipal Code, to allow Five (5) Year Tax Exemptions which allows the Tax Assessor to regard the full and true value or a portion thereof of certain improvements as not increasing the full and true value of certain property for a period of five (5) years, provided the owner's application is approved by the Tax Assessor and by Ordinance of the Municipal Council; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:21-9 and Section 304-12 of the Municipal Code, a tax exemption for the construction of a new five (5) story building to contain approximately one hundred thirty-two (132) market rate residential rental units and a ground floor parking structure with approximately eighty (80) parking spaces is permitted for a period of five (5) years; and

WHEREAS, 39 NY Avenue Apartments, LLC [Entity], is the owner of Property designated as Block 6001, Lot 35, on the City's Tax Map and more commonly known by the street address of 39 New York Avenue, Jersey City, NJ; and

WHEREAS, the Entity now plans to construct a new five (5) story building to contain approximately one hundred thirty-two (132) market rate residential rental units and a ground floor parking structure with approximately eighty (80) parking spaces; and

WHEREAS, construction will be substantially complete on or about October 2019; and

WHEREAS, on or about August 2017, the Entity filed an application for a five (5) year tax exemption to construct a new multi family residential Project, a copy of which application is attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, 39 NY Ave Apartments, LLC, proposes to pay the City, in addition to the full taxes on the land, which shall continue to be conventionally assessed and are

currently taxed at the sum of \$96,201, a tax payment for the new improvements on the property, as follows:

- (a) 2019: the tax year in which the structure will be completed, \$0 taxes due on improvements;
- (b) 2020: the second tax year, 20% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$114,884;
- (c) 2021: the third tax year, 40% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$234,364;
- (d) 2022: the fourth tax year, 60% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$358,577; and
- (e) 2023: the fifth tax year, 80% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$487,665;

WHEREAS, the Tax Assessor has determined that the new construction will generate an additional tax payment of \$96,201 for land and \$563,159 for improvements, for a total of \$659,360 a year; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has agreed that in the event the Citywide revaluation results in a decrease in the estimated amount of actual taxes otherwise due, then for purposes of calculating a tax payment hereunder and for the five (5) year period, the amount shall be calculated on the higher of the amount estimated hereunder or the actual taxes otherwise due; and

WHEREAS, the application for tax exemption was complete and timely filed; the application was approved by the Tax Assessor and the commercial Project is eligible for tax exemption pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:21-9 and Section 304-12 of the Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, upon the expiration of the tax exemption, the total assessment, including both land and improvements, will generate a total tax payment of \$563,159; and

WHEREAS, 39 NY Avenue Apartments, LLC, has agreed to pay the sum of \$220,140 to the City's Affordable Housing Trust Fund, which shall be paid in intervals set forth in Section 304-28 of the Municipal Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Municipal Council of the City of Jersey City that:

1. The application, attached hereto, for a five (5) year tax exemption for the full and true value of a new five (5) story building to contain approximately one hundred thirty-two (132) market rate residential rental units and a ground floor parking structure with approximately eighty (80) parking spaces, located in Block 6001, Lot 35, and more commonly known by the street address of 39 New York Avenue, Jersey City, N.J., is hereby approved.

2. The Mayor or Business Administrator is hereby authorized to execute a tax exemption agreement which shall contain at a minimum, the following terms and conditions:

- (a) tax payment on the new improvements shall be:
 - (i) Year 1: the tax year in which the structure will be completed. \$0 taxes;
 - (ii) Year 2: the second tax year, 20% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$114,884;

- (iii) Year 3: the third tax year, 40% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$234,364;
- (iv) Year 4: the fourth tax year, 60% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$358,577; and
- (v) Year 5: the fifth tax year, 80% of taxes otherwise due on improvements, estimated to be \$487,665.

The applicant has agreed that in the event the Citywide revaluation results in a decrease in the amount of actual taxes otherwise due for purposes of calculating a tax payment hereunder; during this five (5) year period, the amount due hereunder shall be calculated on the higher of the amount estimated above or the actual taxes due after the revaluation; and

(b) The project shall be subject to all federal, state and local laws, and regulations on pollution control, worker safety, discrimination in employment, zoning, planning, and building code requirements pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:21-11(b).

(c) If, during any tax year prior to the termination of the tax agreement, the property owner ceases to operate or disposes of the property, or fails to meet the conditions for qualifying, then the tax which would have otherwise been payable for each tax year shall become due and payable from the property owner as if no exemption and abatement had been granted. The collector forthwith ad the tax collector shall, within 15 days thereof, notify the owner of the property of the amount of taxes due.

(d) With respect to the disposal of the property, where it is determined that the new owner of the property will continue to use the property pursuant to the conditions which qualified the property, no tax shall be due, the exemption shall continue, and the agreement shall remain in effect.

(e) At the termination of a tax exemption agreement, the new improvements shall be subject to all applicable real property taxes as provided by State law and regulation and local ordinance; but nothing herein shall prohibit a project, at the termination of an agreement, from qualifying for, an receiving the full benefits of, any other tax preferences provided by law.

(f) Affordable Housing Trust Fund: \$1,500 x 132 units and \$1.50 x 14,760 square feet of parking space, for a total payment of \$220,140.

- 3. An obligation to execute a Project Employment and Contracting Agreement to insure employment and other economic benefits to City residents and businesses.
- 4. This Ordinance will sunset and the Tax Exemption will terminate unless construction of the Project achieves Substantial Completion within thirty-six (36) months of the date of adoption of the within Ordinance.
- 5. The form of tax exemption agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit B, subject to such modification as the Corporation counsel or Business Administrator deems necessary.
- 6. The Tax Assessor shall send a copy of the fully executed Financial Agreement will be sent to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs within thirty (30) days of execution pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40a:21-11(d).

A. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

B. This ordinance shall be part of the Jersey City Code as though codified and fully set forth therein. The City Clerk shall have this ordinance codified and incorporated in the official copies of the Jersey City Code.

C. This ordinance shall take effect at the time and in the manner provided by law.

D. The City Clerk and Corporation Counsel be and they are hereby authorized and directed to change any chapter numbers, article numbers and section numbers in the event that the codification of this ordinance reveals that there is a conflict between those numbers and the existing code, in order to avoid confusion and possible accidental repealers of existing provisions.




