An Important Checklist to Ensure Your Safety

- Obtaining a permit for boiler replacements, hot water heaters, and electrical services has been waived for 30 days.
- Contractors must still notify building department of proposed worksite(s) at 201-547-5563.
- In areas in where flooding has occurred, circuit breakers, fuse panels, furnaces and hot water heaters should be replaced.
- If circuit panels have been damaged by water, turn them off. They must be replaced.
- Prior to power being restored in flooded areas, all appliances should be unplugged and sockets should be replaced.
- Residents should use qualified licensed plumbers and electricians.
- Requests for home or building inspections should be made to the Mayor’s Action Bureau 201-547-4900.
- For damaged electrical meters, contact PSE&G at 1-800-436-PSEG (7734).
- Finally, City inspectors will be in your neighborhood to discuss these issues with you.
